Dear Mr. Dumoff,

Thank you for your letter of March 8, 2022, in response to our letters of December 13, 2021 and February 1, 2022. We appreciate the revised reference to the physician list—such that the physician list is now referred to as “COVID-19 Care Providers”—as well as other changes to the FLCCC website.

As we stated in our previous correspondence, the Health Care Bureau is concerned by the potential for consumers to be misled when the FLCCC solely promotes unapproved modes of prevention and treatment of COVID-19 as more effective than others without considering a consumer’s individual circumstances. The Bureau declines to intervene in the patient/provider relationship. We are pleased that you are in agreement that prevention and treatment decisions are best made after individual patient/provider discussions. We appreciate your commitment to fully informed consent, but decline to approve any agreements. We expect that all health care providers will obtain the necessary informed consent prior to the initiation of any medical care.
