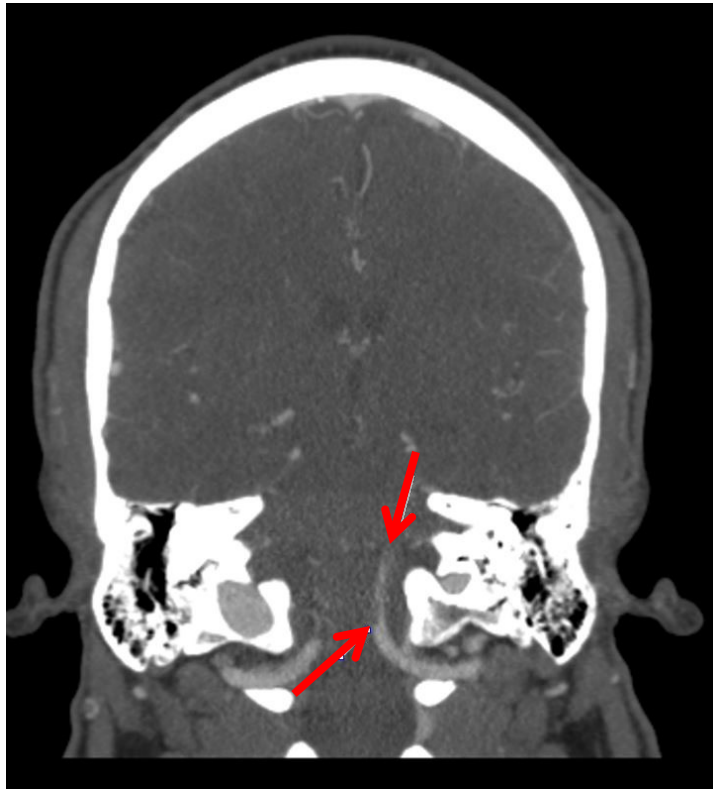

- Arrival BP 80/40 mm Hg



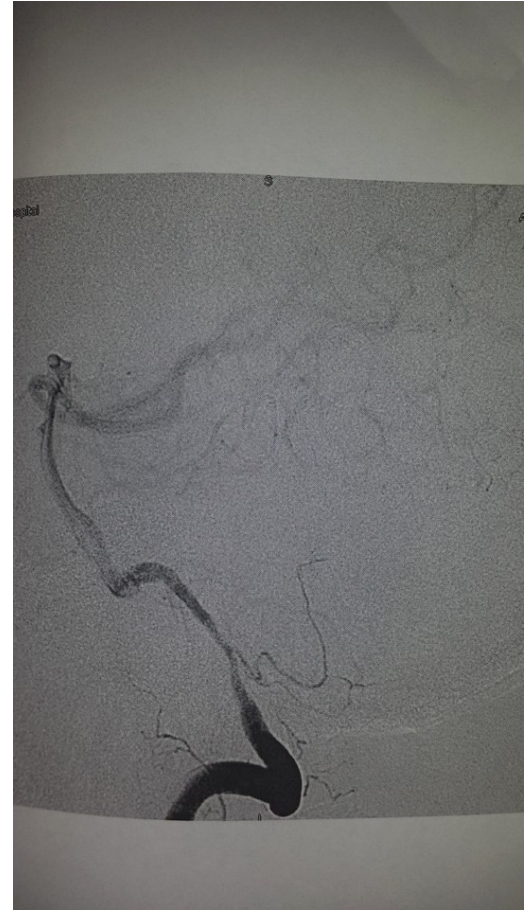
MRI: DWI image

4 Vessel Angiogram

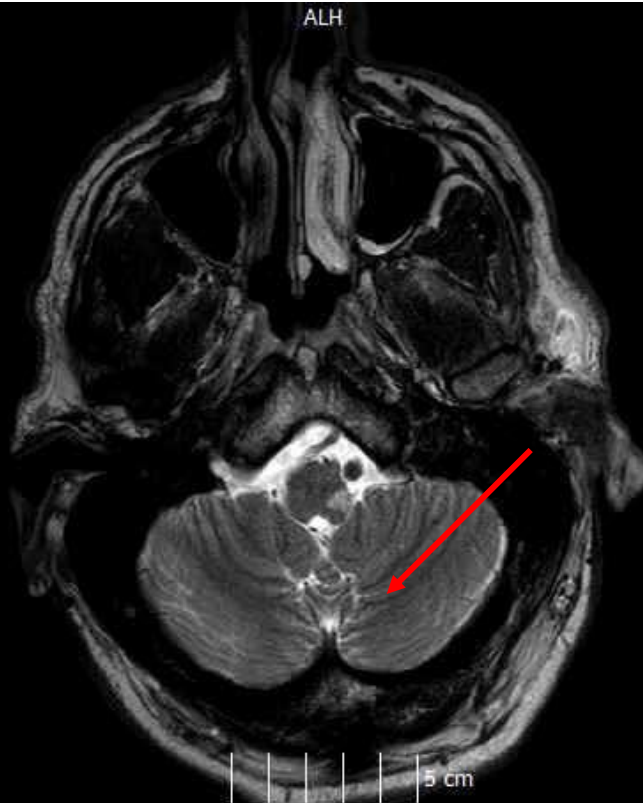

	Traditional Chinese Medicine	Western Medicine
Diagnosis	Qualitative: Assess complexion, constitution, pulse, etc., to discern a pattern of symptoms	Quantitative: Measure temperature, heart rate, blood oxygen levels; blood, urine and gene tests, etc., to discern a disease
Treatment	Cocktails of herbal medicines, acupuncture, food therapy, manipulating chi—tailored to the individual	Mostly single synthetic drugs, surgery—usually applied for a specific malady
Discovery	Trial and error, empirical experience, randomized controlled trials on herbal pharmaceuticals	Scientific method, randomized controlled trials
